# The Dealy Dangers of Crossing a Runway: A Threat to Aviation Safety

#### The Problem

Runway incursions, where an aircraft, vehicle, or person enters a runway area can pose a significant threat to aviation safety and PML is no exception. One of the most critical and often overlooked types of runway incursions is driving across a runway. This hazardous behavior can have devastating consequences, resulting in fatalities, injuries, and damage to aircraft. There have been an increasing number of vehicles and pedestrians observed crossing the runway at Pine Mountain Lake, including multiple incidents that resulted in a near collision between an airplane and a pedestrian or vehicle.

#### The Risks

Driving across a runway is a recipe for disaster. Aircraft are designed to operate at high speeds, and even a slow-moving vehicle can become a deadly obstacle. The potential for collisions is high, particularly during takeoff and landing when aircraft are most vulnerable. In many, if not most, aircraft forward visibility is limited as well.

#### **Statistics**

According to the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA), general aviation pilots are responsible for almost half of the approximately 1,600 runway incursions that occur annually in the United States. While these incidents may seem isolated, they can have far-reaching consequences. In 2020, the International Air Transport Association (IATA) reported that runway incursions resulted in 14 fatalities and 23 injuries worldwide.

#### Causes

Several factors contribute to runway incursions, including:

**Lack of situational awareness:** Pilots and drivers may fail to recognize the runway's protected status or neglect to comply with airport signage.

**Distractions:** Inattention to the environment, such as texting or using electronic devices, can lead to mistakes.

**Unfamiliarity with airport layouts:** Drivers may be unfamiliar with airport signage, markings, and lighting, increasing the risk of errors. **Prevention Strategies** 

**Sterile cockpit:** Pilots should thoroughly brief themselves on airport layouts, signage, and ATC procedures before landing or taking off. Avoid distractions, such as using electronic devices, during critical phases of flight. When you brief your passengers be sure to tell them to avoid conversation while you are taxing, taking off, landing, or operating anywhere near an airport.

**Don't drive or walk across the runway:** Thanks to several hard-working volunteers, a donation from our local EAA chapter, and in cooperation with Tuolumne County, a vehicle bypass road was recently completed at the west end of the PML airport. If you can avoid crossing the runway, please do. But if it is necessary to cross, PLEASE use the new road and NOT the taxiway. Before you cross, even when on the bypass road, stop and look very carefully for any aircraft that might be approaching the runway. While there are currently no signs marking the new road, appropriate signage is in the works.

**Situational awareness:** Pilots, passengers, drivers and pedestrians alike must always maintain constant vigilance, scanning the environment for potential hazards.

**Get the word out:** If you see someone crossing the runway, politely point out that there is now a service road at the west end of the runway they can use to help avoid creating a hazard.

#### Conclusion

There have been an alarming number of vehicular and pedestrian runway incursions at PML recently. Driving across a runway is a reckless and dangerous behavior that can have catastrophic consequences. By understanding the risks, causes, and prevention strategies, we can work together to reduce the incidence of runway incursions and ensure the safety of all aviation stakeholders. It is essential for pilots, drivers, and pedestrians to prioritize situational

awareness to prevent these deadly incidents. Fly Safe, Drive Safe, Walk Safe! - Doe
